



The Southern Sons - get it off



Specialist short season maize

A poor crop of maize is the cheapest energy you can grow.



This Spring and early Summer is likely to be wet. Don't get caught with harvesting maize too young or wrecking paddocks in Autumn. HSR has been breeding maize for exactly these southern climates, cooler Springs and shorter summers.

Selected for the south and widely adapted to cool, wet and shorter seasons

There's a reason Queenslanders complain about the cold when they come down here, they aren't bred for it.

Most maize in Southern Victoria and Tasmania won't go in until mid November and lots will be planted in December, that's fine if you pick the right maturity. Following your pasture silage, get your maize in ASAP anytime from the start of October.

As you get later then choose a shorter maturity. You need to get your maize off by mid April and your winter crop in, otherwise any yield advantage in the maize is lost over winter
